VN, US exhibit science projects

HÀ NỘI — The results of the co-operation in science and technology by Việt Nam and the United States are now on display in Hà Nội.

The four-day exhibition titled "US - Việt Nam Science and Technology Days" is a joint effort by the US State Department and Việt Nam's Science and Technology Ministry and ends Friday.

It is being held at the Cultural Friendship Palace in Trần Hưng Đạo Street and in addition to showing the results of the co-operation, the display promotes future joint efforts.

The exhibition includes stalls from more than 36 science and technology centres.

The exhibition will be complemented by four science workshops, which began yesterday and will end today, as well as the 5th meeting of the Việt Nam - America Joint Committee for Science and Technology Co-operation.

"This is the chance for the scientists and enterprises of both countries to exchange their experience in scientific research and technology transfer," said Deputy Science and Technology Minister Bùi Mạnh Hải.

Co-operation in science and technology between the two countries had included Information and Technology, oceanography, public medicine, agriculture and education.

National Institute of Oc-

cupational and Environmental Health representative Trần Mông Lạc said: "We have long co-operated with American partners.

"But this is a chance for us to widen the co-operation."
